GAME OVERVIEW

- The Stamps have an all-time regular-season record of 111-84-8 against Saskatchewan, including a 65-33-4 mark at home.
- Calgary is coming off a 48-10 road victory over BC on July 24.
- The Riders are coming off a 38-33 home loss to Edmonton on July 25.
- Calgary was 7-2 at home in 2008 and is 1-1 this season. Saskatchewan was 5-4 on the road in 2008 and is 1-0 this season.
- The teams split four games last season with the Stamps losing 22-21 at home on Aug. 2, winning 30-25 on the road on Aug. 7, losing 37-34 on the road on Oct. 3 and winning 42-5 at home on Oct. 13.
- Saskatchewan has allowed the CFL's most points (141) and Calgary has scored the second most in the league (149).
- Stamps SB Nik Lewis has a reception in 91 consecutive games.

- Calgary is 5-5 in its last 10 games against the Riders at McMahon Stadium.
- The Stamps are 5-5 in their last 10 games against Saskatchewan.
- Stamps QB Henry Burris is on pace to beat most of Doug Flutie's career franchise passing records by mid-season.
- Stamps K Sandro DeAngelis is the most accurate field goal kicker in CFL history (186-for-220, 84.5 per cent) and he is 10-for-10 in 2009.
- Calgary RB Joffrey Reynolds leads the CFL with five touchdowns, while teammate Jeremaine Copeland is next with four.
- Calgary has 37 players back from its Grey Cup 46-man roster, including 12 offensive starters and six defensive starters.
- The Stamps have a plus-5 turnover ratio and a league-high 75 points off turnovers. The Riders are even and have 69 points off turnovers.



STAMPEDERS STORYLINES

STAMPS TRYING TO GO OVER .500

The Stamps began the 2009 season with two losses — the only time they've been below .500 under head coach/GM John Hufnagel. A 48-10 road win over the BC Lions last week bumped their record to 2-2 and they're trying to go over .500 for the first time in 2009. The Stamps were 3-1 after four games in 2008 and lost their Week 5 game in Winnipeg.

NUCLEUS INTACT

The Stamps have 37 players back from the 46 men who were on the 2008 Grey Cup roster. The only departures are: LB JoJuan Armour, DL Eddie Freeman, DL Howard Hodges, DL Charleston Hughes, DL Pat MacDonald, LB Saleem Rasheed, LB Neil Ternovatsky, OL Antonio Hall and QB Will Proctor.

In addition, all 12 Grey Cup offensive starters are back with the club, as are six defensive starters.

NO. 1 CLOSING ON NO. 1

Burris is quickly closing on Doug Flutie in most major franchise passing categories. At his current pace, he will become the all-time leader in passing yards, touchdown passes, pass attempts and completions this summer. Here's a look at how Burris fits into the club's leaderboards:

BURRIS SET TO BUILD ON 2008

Stamps quarterback Henry Burris had a career year in 2008 and was named the West Division nominee for Most Outstanding Player before he was the Grey Cup MVP.

Under his direction, the Stamps led the CFL with a 13-5 record and won two playoff games, including the Grey Cup over Montreal. Burris was particularly good when the games mattered most. He had a 10-3 record (including post-season) against teams with a winning record.

Burris also led all CFL quarterbacks with 595 rushing yards (career high is 623, in 2007), to go with a career-high 8.6 yards per carry and three touchdowns

Burris threw his 100th touchdown as a member of the Stampeders in Week 11 last season against Edmonton. Ryan Thelwell was on the receiving end of the three-yard touchdown. HUFF THE VET

In his second year as head coach/GM of the Stamps, John Hufnagel owns the second-longest active tenure of any head coach in the CFL. Huff was hired on Dec. 3, 2007. Only Wally Buono of the BC Lions has been with his team longer. Here is the list, in order of service time:

SIX NEW STARTERS ON DEFENCE

While the Stamps enjoy some continuity from their 2008 championship season, many changes have been made to the starting defence. In fact, there are six first-year CFLers among the starting dozen, while Mike Labinjo is in his first season at defensive tackle after playing defensive end in 2008, and second-year safety Milton Collins started just two games as a rookie last season. The entire defensive unit has played well and here's how the six newcomers are doing through four games:

MLB Tray Blackmon: Tied for second on the club with 13 tackles and tied for the team lead with four special-teams tackles. Also forced a fumble and has a tackle for a loss.

DE Odell Willis: Tied for league lead with five sacks. Also has six tackles, a forced fumble and a tackle for a loss.

DE Malik Jackson: Second on the team with two sacks and tied for team lead with four special-teams tackles. Also has four tackles, a forced fumble and a tackle for a loss.

HB Davanzo Tate: Tied for second on the team with 13 tackles and has an interception and a forced fumble.

HB Ronnie Amadi: Tied for second on the team with 13 tackles and has two pass knockdowns and a sack.

DT Tom Johnson: In two games since he joined the lineup, opponents have averaged 75.5 rushing yards and 224 yards net offence per game. He has five tackles, a sack and a tackle for a loss.

STAMPS YOUNG ON DEFENCE

Only the Hamilton Tiger-Cats have a younger starting defence than Calgary's dominant dozen. Led by six first-year players, the Stamps' average age is 25.7 years. Tray Blackmon is the youngest at 23 (Oct. 20, 1985), while Dwaine Carpenter is the oldest at 32 (Nov. 4, 1976). Here's how all CFL teams compare:

TERRIFIC TWO-GAME TOTAL

The Stampeders defence has allowed a total of just 19 points in the past two weeks in wins over Toronto and BC. That's the Stamps' lowest two-game total of points allowed since 2001. It's just the second time in 13 seasons Calgary has yielded fewer than 20 points over a two-game stretch.

RYAN A DUAL THREAT ON RETURNS

While Markus Howell has had solid punt-return numbers over the past three seasons, rookie Titus Ryan has given the Stamps a steady return threat on both punts and kickoffs. He currently is averaging 10.5 yards per punt return and 28.0 per kickoff return.

Since 1996, there have only been three seasons in which a Stamps returner has averaged at least 10 yards per punt and 20 yards per kickoff in the same season (minimum 10 returns for each).

CLUTCH CANADIANS

Few receivers in the CFL make more of their opportunities than Canadian receivers Ryan Thelwell and Teyo Johnson, who have made a tremendous impact with limited touches. Thelwell has scored or gained a first down on a remarkable 83.9 per cent of his touches over the past two seasons, while Johnson has done so on 76.5 per cent. Here is a detailed look at the duo's work over the past two seasons:

Despite a late rally, the Stampeders were unable to hand the visiting Saskatchewan Roughriders their first loss of the season.

Before a sold-out crowd of 35,650, Sandro DeAngelis missed a late 54-yard field goal and the Stamps fell 22-21. A 50-yard bomb from Henry Burris to Jeremaine Copeland with one second remaining set up the three-point attempt. The Stamps struggled early and fell behind 21-7 at halftime. It didn't help matters when starting middle linebacker JoJuan Armour was wrongfully ejected on Calgary's second defensive play of the night. The league ruled a day after the game that Armour was wrongfully accused of physically abusing an official.

With a second remaining in the opening quarter, Saskatchewan quarterback Marcus Crandell found Adarius Bowman for a touchdown and a 10-4 lead. Crandell later completed a pass to Matt Dominguez, who fumbled when he was hit by Shannon James. But the loose ball bounced right to Riders running back Wes Cates, who picked it up and scored, giving the Roughriders a 14-point lead at the half.

Out of the break, Burris hit Nik Lewis for a 22-yard touchdown to make the score 21-14. The catch put Lewis over 5,000 receiving yards for his career.

Burris completed 22 passes for 304 yards with one touchdown and an interception. Joffrey Reynolds rushed 10 times for 48 yards. Brett Ralph was the top Calgary receiver with seven catches for 78 yards and Lewis added five catches for 71 yards and a touchdown.

The Calgary Stampeders survived a late charge by the Saskatchewan Roughriders for a 30-25 victory at Regina's Mosaic Stadium.

Joffrey Reynolds was Calgary's offensive workhorse as he rushed for 128 yards and a touchdown on 24 carries.

"It was a hard win and we had to battle to the end," said Reynolds. "Our offensive line did a good job. We have three rookies playing up there and they played well." The Stamps rolled out to a 30-4 lead after three quarters as the offence and defence were stellar. Saskatchewan rallied with 21 fourth-quarter points before Calgary finally shut the door.

Saskatchewan running back Wes Cates, who ran for 139 rushing yards in the Roughriders' win over Calgary five days earlier, was held to 20 yards on eight carries.

The Stamps took the lead when quarterback Henry Burris ran for a seven-yard touchdown. The Stamps later put together a 67-yard drive and Reynolds scored a three-yard run for a 23-4 lead at the halftime break.

Ken-Yon Rambo caught a 26-yard strike from Burris in the third quarter to extend Calgary's lead.

The Roughriders' fourth-quarter rally began when two Calgary defensive backs collided and a tipped ball fell into the arms of Adarius Bowman for a 52-yard major from Marcus Crandell. Saskatchewan then blocked a punt and Chris Szarka recovered for a touchdown.

With a little more than two minutes left, Weston Dressler caught a 25-yard pass from Crandell but the Stamps put together some clutch first downs in the final minutes to snuff out the comeback.

The Calgary Stampeders lost a game but won a playoff spot. The Stamps fell 37-34 to the Saskatchewan Roughriders at Regina's Mosaic Stadium and their record dropped to 9-5 but earlier in the evening, a Toronto Argonauts loss guaranteed Calgary at least a CFL crossover post-season berth. Roughriders running back Neal Hughes scored two touchdowns as the Stamps saw their four-game winning streak evaporate. Chris Getzlaf also scored a touchdown for Saskatchewan as he hauled in a nine-yard pass. Riders defensive end Kitwana Jones picked up a fumble and rumbled 15 yards to cross the goal-line for another major. Calgary receivers Ken-Yon Rambo and Ryan Thelwell caught passes for touchdowns while quarterback Henry Burris scored on a three-yard naked bootleg. Stamps kicker Sandro DeAngelis was four-for-four on field goals, with his longest from 39 yards. Roughriders kicker Luca Congi nailed three field goals, including a 47-yard field goal, on four attempts. Calgary held a 21-17 lead at the midway point after the squads traded touchdowns and field goals in the final 10 minutes of the opening half. Within the first 30 seconds of the third quarter, Riders defensive end Stevie Baggs knocked the ball from Burris' hands and Jones picked up the loose ball and ran 15 yards into the end zone. With the convert, Saskatchewan was up 27-21. Calgary added two more field goals but Saskatchewan responded with Hughes' second touchdown of the contest and a field goal. Despite a 33-yard Thelwell touchdown with less than two minutes remaining in the game, Calgary couldn't overcome the deficit.

The Calgary Stampeders moved into top spot in the West Division by beating the Saskatchewan Roughriders 42-5 before a sellout crowd at McMahon Stadium. Milton Collins led Calgary's spirited defensive effort with two interceptions and a sack. Lenny Walls had a pick in his CFL debut and the Stamps forced seven turnovers while committing none. This was the second time in 2008 the Stamps held an opponent without a touchdown. Calgary kicker Sandro DeAngelis led Calgary's special teams with four field goals and Henry Burris paced the offence with 14 completions in 28 attempts for 304 yards and three touchdowns. Calgary's second offensive play of the afternoon was an 81-yard pass Burris to Ken-Yon Rambo that put Calgary up 7-0. Jeremaine Copeland caught an 18-yard touchdown pass from Burris in the second quarter and, combined with seven points from DeAngelis, the hosts built a 21-4 lead at halftime. After two more field goals from DeAngelis in the third quarter, Burris connected with Nik Lewis on a short pass. Lewis then bounced off two defenders and rumbled up the sideline for an 85-yard major. Barrick Nealy relieved Burris with three minutes remaining and Calgary put together a 66-yard drive (on five runs) that was capped by Demetris Summers' first CFL touch-down — a six-yard score. With a nine-yard reception in the first half, Lewis caught a pass for his 85th consecutive game and tied Allen Pitts for the franchise record. With his fourth field goal of the game, DeAngelis moved into third all-time in franchise history with 172.

The Calgary Stampeders couldn't overcome a poor start or the kicking of Damon Duval in their 2009 season-opener at McMahon Stadium. The Stamps fell into an early 20-0 hole and wound up losing 40-27 to the Montreal Alouettes as the rematch of the 2008 Grey Cup produced a different winner.

Calgary had a late chance to take the lead thanks to a blocked punt by Tristan Black that gave the Stamps the ball at the Montreal 23-yard line. However, a sack of Henry Burris, a fumble and a recovery by Chip Cox led to a game-sealing 81-yard return touchdown. Calgary turned the ball over four times and also committed 10 penalties.

After a poor first quarter that saw Calgary fall behind 17-0, a couple of special plays by the special teams in the second quarter helped get the Stamps back into the contest. First, a spectacular 104-yard kickoff return by rookie Titus Ryan gave the home team its first points of the night.

Then, a blocked punt by Wes Lysack and a recovery by Dwight Anderson gave the Stamps the ball at the Montreal 31. Calgary capitalized with its second touchdown of the game, capping the drive with a four-yard touchdown pass from Burris to Jeremaine Copeland.

Calgary knotted the score at 27-27 with 10 third-quarter points. First, Burris scored a touchdown on a four-yard keeper and Sandro DeAngelis booted a 41-yard field goal to pull Calgary even.

The Alouettes were very sharp from the opening kickoff as they took the first drive 81 yards on five plays for a touchdown. Calvillo and Kerry Watkins connected on a 37-yard strike to complete the sequence. Second time with the ball, the Als doubled their lead as Avon Cobourne ran the ball in from 10 yards.

Costly turnovers, untimely penalties and, for a good part of the night, an ineffective offence added up the Calgary Stampeders' second straight loss to open the 2009 Canadian Football League season. Four Calgary giveaways led to four Winnipeg touchdowns at Canad Inns Stadium as Calgary dropped a 42-30 decision to the Blue Bombers.

For a second consecutive week, the Stampeders stumbled out of the gate.

The Blue Bombers' Mike Kelly — who collected his first win as a head coach on the night — resorted to some trickery on the game's opening kick-off as he asked Alexis Serna to boot the ball short. The play worked as Winnipeg recovered and that set up a five-play, 39-yard drive for a 24-yard Serna field goal.

After Calgary went two-and-out on its first possession, the Blue Bombers came right back to march the ball 67 yards for a touchdown. The drive was capped by an eight-yard touchdown pass from Stefan LeFors to Terrence Edwards. Winnipeg added a second LeFors-to-Edwards touchdown connection late in the opening half.

The clubs traded short touchdowns runs in the third quarter. First, it was Lavarus Giles running the ball in from the two for the Bombers' third touchdown of the night. The Stamps replied with their first major as Joffrey Reynolds caught a pitch and scored from the one-yard line.

The Stamps tried to mount a comeback with a 99-yard drive that was capped by Henry Burris' one-yard keeper for a touchdown, but the Bombers bounced right back with an interception return for touchdown by Siddeeq Shabazz. Giles' second touchdown run of the game was essentially the icing on the cake for the Bombers. Barrick Nealy, who relieved Burris, led the Red and White on a couple of late touchdown drives to make the final score somewhat more respectable. First, he hooked up with Jeremaine Copeland and then he found Teyo Johnson in the end-zone in the final minute of the game.

The win was Calgary's first of 2009 and allows the Stampeders to pull into a three-way tie for second place in the West Division with Edmonton and BC. Not only did the defence record six sacks and hold the Argos out of the end-zone, the unit scored three touchdowns — one on Dwaine Carpenter's fumble return and two on interception returns by Dwight Anderson and Brandon Browner. Running back Joffrey Reynolds scored a couple of touchdowns for Calgary — one rushing and one receiving — as the Stampeders extended their home-field winning streak against the Boatmen to four games. For the first time this season, the Stampeders opened the scoring as Reynolds ran the ball in from the one-yard line in the opening quarter. With the touchdown, Reynolds moved past Willie Burden and into fifth place on the Stampeders' all-time list in rushing majors. The two great running backs started the night tied with 32 rushing touchdowns apiece. During the first half, Henry Burris moved past Jeff Garcia (2,358 yards) to become the leading all-time rusher among Stampeders quarterbacks. He also surpassed Hugh McKinnis (2,357) and took over seventh spot on the overall all-time Stamps rushing list. One of the turning points of the night came on the final play of the third quarter. The Argos set up in the Wildcat formation with running back Jamal Robertson taking the snap. Robertson handed the ball to quarterback Kerry Joseph, who was immediately pressured. Carpenter hit Joseph, forced the fumble, recovered the ball and ran it back 55 yards for a touchdown.

In the absence of a couple of key receivers Friday at BC Place, the Calgary Stampeders turned to a couple of familiar faces — and one new face — on the way to recording a 48-10 victory over the BC Lions. With Nik Lewis back in Calgary and Ken-Yon Rambo forced to leave the game in the first quarter, Henry Burris went to veteran Jeremaine Copeland and rookie Jermaine Jackson to float the Stampeders' air attack. Copeland hauled in two touchdown passes and Jackson had one catch for a score. The other big story offensively was Joffrey Reynolds, who rushed for 131 yards and scored two touchdowns as the Stampeders posted a second straight victory to even their season record to 2-2. In the process of having his big night, Reynolds surpassed Willie Burden for fourth place on the Stamps' all-time rushing list. Reynolds now has 6,260 yards compared to 6,234 for Burden. The first-half touchdowns by Copeland and Jackson marked a milestone score for each receiver. For Copeland, it was his 34th career receiving major with the Stampeders, tying him with Gerry Shaw for ninth on the franchise's all-time list. For Jackson, it was the first touchdown of the rookie's CFL career. Early in the third quarter, Burris found Copeland again for a seven-yard passing score. Copeland thought he had a third touchdown later in the quarter but the on-field officials ruled a great diving catch attempt as an incomplete pass and a challenge and video review failed to overturn the call. Undaunted, the Stamps defence continued to dog the Lions. In particular, Odell Willis picked up his fourth and fifth sacks of the season and also recovered a fumble. Meanwhile, Calgary tacked on more points thanks to a pair of touchdowns by Reynolds and a couple of field goals by Sandro DeAngelis.

Calgary signed Johnson as a free agent in June of 2008. He was drafted by the Oakland Raiders in the second round (63rd overall) of the 2003 NFL draft. He was signed by the Arizona Cardinals in 2005. He went to training camp with the Miami Dolphins in 2006 and then went to the Denver Broncos camp in 2007. He signed with Buffalo on Jan. 29, 2008.

2008

In his first season in the CFL, Johnson established himself as a versatile player for the Red and White. Johnson started 13 regular-season games at fullback, but was utilized mostly as an H-back/tight end. He had his best game of the season against Montreal on Sept. 12 when he had four catches for 89 yards (22.3 per catch average) and his first CFL touchdown. The major came on a last-second 53-yard Hail Mary pass from Henry Burris going into halftime. Johnson had the second-highest receiving average (16.5 yards per grab) on the team for the season. He converted 80 per cent of his receptions into a touchdown or first down, the highest percentage on the team. He started in both the West Final and Grey Cup.
